

Grants awarded in June 2015 amounted to 2.18% of total net assets; administrative and salary expenses were 1.09%.of total net assets.

The change in our net assets for FY 2014-2015 was a gain of 2.67%

Grant Recipients

One of the guiding principles of the Portiuncula Foundation is that grants must be in conformity with the social teachings of the Roman Catholic Church.

Grants given in support of educational endeavors, each with a particular social component:

- \$15,000 to the Sisters of St. Francis of the Neumann Communities in support of the food program for undernourished children at the St. Elizabeth and St. Clare schools in their Kenya, Africa mission.
- \$5,000 to Sisters Place, Inc. helps underwrite the six-week day camp for the resident children in Clairton, Pennsylvania
- \$5,000 to Orchestra On the Hill, Inc. (St. Benedict the Moor Site) for maintenance and repair of string instruments. This program teaches music in a way that is structured to develop a broad range of skills and attitudes.
- \$1,000 to St. Anthony of Padua School, Greenville, South Carolina

Grant Recipients continued

Grants given in support of ministry to the growing population of Hispanic immigrants in western Pennsylvania:

- \$10,000 to the Sisters of St. Francis of the Neumann Communities in support of the ministry of Sister Susanne Susany, Esq. who provides legal services and representation in court to poor Hispanic immigrants.
- \$3,000 to Casa San José, Inc. established by the Sisters of St. Joseph as a center of welcome and resources for Latino immigrants in Pittsburgh

The Portiuncula Foundation promotes a broad vision of health that includes spiritual, emotional, physical, social, and economic well-being.

Grants awarded in keeping with this broad vision of health:

- \$5,000 to The Intersection, Inc. in support of their on-site meal, family food pantry, and emergency support programs
- \$5,000 to East Liberty Family Health Care Center to improve access to dental care and oral health education for underserved and vulnerable persons
- \$5,000 to Duquesne University in support of the outreach pharmacy services to the elderly residents in senior high-rises located in the Hill District and Uptown neighborhoods of Pittsburgh
- \$5,000 to Bethlehem Haven in support of the A Step Up program
- \$10,000 to the sisters of St. Francis of the Neumann Communities for the purchase of a mobile vital signs unit and replacement of three hospital beds and lift chairs for the health care unit at Mount Alvernia
- \$14,000 to the Change A Heart Franciscan Volunteer Program, a sponsored ministry of the Sisters of St. Francis, to help support the placement of a Change a Heart member in service at St. Joseph House of Hospitality

Scholarship Recipients

The Portiuncula Foundation awards scholarships on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis to one or more students working to obtain a nursing diploma or degree at a western Pennsylvania Catholic institution of higher education. These memorial scholarships, originally established at the former St. Francis Medical Center School of Nursing, were transferred to the Portiuncula Foundation by the donor families. The scholarship application process is administered by the Portiuncula Foundation, while selection of final awardees is made by the respective families or their delegate.
